16 March, 2010

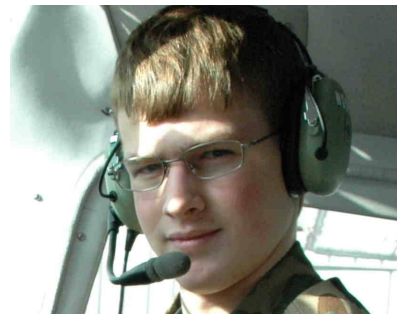
Lt Wojtuck led a training session in leadership.

A prize will be awarded to the Cadet or Officer who suggests the best caption for the picture

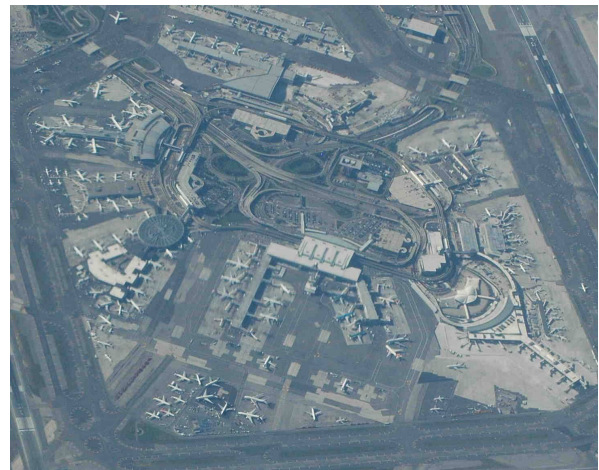
below. A sample caption, somewhat long-winded, is offered. The sample will give you some background information to assist you in formulating a hopefully shorter, caption.
